



Disability Equality Policy

Medipathways College is committed to Disability Equality and understands the need to embrace the spirit of the Disability Equality Duty detailed in the Disability Discrimination Act 2006 (DDA) and the Equality Act 2010.

Definition of Disability

A person has a disability if they have a physical or mental impairment that has a substantial and long-term adverse effect on his or her ability to carry out normal day to day activities.

Our Aims and Objectives for Disability Equality

Our objective is to reduce and eliminate barriers to accessing the curriculum and to full participation of staff and students in the college community.

We aim to promote equality of opportunity between Disabled People and non-Disabled People; eliminate discrimination that is unlawful under the Disability Discrimination Act; to take steps to meet disabled people's needs and to ensure that they are not put at a disadvantage; to ensure that disabled people are not discriminated against in the admissions process; and to make reasonable adjustments to academic arrangements.

Accessibility for Disabled Pupils

Lectures, tutorials, and practicals take place at Birkbeck College, University of London with additional tutorial rooms and registry support at 4 Bloomsbury Square. In both premises, there is full wheelchair access available with lifts servicing all floors. Access to the entrances of each building can be gained using ramps.

In the case of enrolling a student with a visual or hearing or any other impairment, we would take all reasonable steps to ensure that they would not be placed at a disadvantage and received the support necessary for successful completion of their programme.
